National Board Certification

 Katherine Plakinger spoke about the requirements of becoming a National Board Certified teacher. It is a very rigorous program for those seeking an advanced teaching credential. It is valid for only 10 years and the renewal process must take place in the 8th or 9th year of certification. Candidates must complete 10 assessments and the assessments must include four portfolios that feature teaching practice and six constructed response exercises that assess content knowledge. Discovery PTSA awarded Katherine Plakinger \$100 for completing her National Board Certification.

ProCert Program

- Nicole McCulloch spoke about ProCert (formally ProTeach) and what it entails. It is a
 professional Washington State teacher certification program that has strict parameters.
 It evaluates teachers on their ability to impact student learning. It focuses on three
 standards: effective teaching, professional development and professional contributions.
 It also focuses on 12 criteria for the professional certificate approved by the Professional
 Educator Standards Board (PESB).
- Discovery PTSA awarded Nicole McCulloch \$100 for completing her Professional Certification for Teachers. Shea DeAngelis and Justine Kim will also be awarded \$100 for their completion of ProCert at the upcoming Staff meeting on 3/26.
